BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES

SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY—PACIFIC LINES

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that certain work now being performed at Roseville, California, by Car Inspectors, is properly covered by the Clerks' Agreement and should be performed by employes coming within the scope of said Clerks' Agreement.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That both parties to this dispute waived hearing thereon;

That the carrier and the employe involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employe within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That under date of May 16, 1946, the parties jointly advised the Secretary of the Third Division of their desire to withdraw it from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
