**PARTIES TO DISPUTE:**

**THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS**  
**MISSOURI PACIFIC LINES IN TEXAS AND LOUISIANA**

**STATEMENT OF CLAIM:** Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on Missouri Pacific Lines in Texas and Louisiana,

That Operator C. D. Winters, assigned to temporary Vacancy of Agent-Telegrapher position at Huffman, Texas, who was required by the Carrier to perform relief work as telegrapher-leverman in Tower 74, Beaumont, Texas, September 14 through 22, 1945, shall be reimbursed under the provisions of Rule 14 of the telegraphers' agreement for the actual necessary taxi cab fare expense of \$1.00 per day on each of these days incurred by him going to and returning from Tower 74 and his hotel at Beaumont.

**FINDINGS:** The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of March 19, 1947, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

**AWARD**

Case dismissed.
