PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

BROTHERHOOD OF RAILROAD SIGNALMEN OF AMERICA THE PENNSYLVANIA RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen of America on the Pennsylvania Railroad, that:

- (a) The Carrier violated the working agreement when it hired and used a truck equipped with a ground boring machine, derrick, and two workers, to dig holes and set T. & S. line-wire poles in them in East Washington St. Yards, Indianapolis, Indiana, on April 24, 1950.
- (b) Claim for pay for all concerned (as listed in the "Joint Statement of Agreed Upon Facts," Brotherhood's Exhibit "A").

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held and under date of July 28, 1954, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division withdrawing this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
