PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES

UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY (Western Districts)

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employes that the Carrier violated the Clerks' Agreement:

- (a) When they arbitrarily assigned January 2nd, 1956 as a vacation day each for Clerks J. C. Thompson and J. J. Colvin, both employed at the Carrier's Los Angeles Freight Office.
- (b) That Clerks J. C. Thompson and J. J. Colvin be compensated at the rate of time and one-half at the rate of positions they were working, for January 2nd, 1956 in addition to the compensation received for the day.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of February 12, 1957, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
