2. Carrier shall compensate J. F. Flora, Agent-Operator, Oldtown Maryland, for two calls on February 21, 1956; H. E. Kershner, Agent-Operator Hancock, Maryland, for call on February 22 and a call on March 3, 1956; R. E. Trich, Agent-Operator, Big Spring, Maryland, one call on March 3, 1956.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of February 28, 1957, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
