PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS THE PENNSYLVANIA RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of the Order of Railroad Telegraphers on the Pennsylvania Railroad Company that:

Kalamazoo Block Station "Z" is a seven (7) day position and the blanking of this position on Saturdays and Sundays since September 1, 1949, is a violation of Agreement, as the work has not been abolished and instead train orders are being handled at "Vine" and "Dock" through other locations. Therefore, these positions shall be restored on Saturdays and Sundays and all employes caused loss in earnings shall be compensated accordingly, under provisions of Award No. 4042, Third Division, National Railroad Adjustment Board.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of August 13, 1959, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
