PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS

THE BALTIMORE AND OHIO RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegraphers on The Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, that:

- 1. Carrier violated the agreement between the parties hereto when, on April 4, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 30; May 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 28, 29 and 31; June 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 28 and 29; and July 2, 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 16 and 17, 1956, respectively, it caused, permitted and required a conductor, an employe not covered by the Telegraphers' Agreement, to handle (receive, copy and deliver) train lineups for a contractor constructing an overhead bridge over the railroad tracks east of McCool, Indiana, which work was and is reserved solely to employes covered by the Telegraphers' Agreement.
- 2. Carrier be required to compensate an idle telegrapher (extra in preference) for pay for one day (8 hours) on each date hereinbefore listed.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of March 31, 1960, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is thereby granted.

AWARD

Claim dismissed.
