## PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

## THE ORDER OF RAILROAD TELEGRAPHERS THE BALTIMORE AND OHIO RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the General Committee of The Order of Railroad Telegrahers on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, that:

- 1. Carrier violated the Agreement between the parties hereto when on February 13, 1957, it caused, permitted and required a crossing watchman to furnish lineups on trains to employes of the Philadelphia Transit Company who were working on overhead wires at Darby, Pennsylvania.
- 2. Carrier be required to compensate an idle operator, extra in preference, for one day's pay (8 hours) on February 13, 1957, because of said violation.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing was waived and under date of March 31, 1960, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

## AWARD

Claim dismissed.
