#### PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

## BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, FREIGHT HANDLERS, EXPRESS AND STATION EMPLOYES

### CHICAGO, MILWAUKEE, ST. PAUL AND PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- 1. Carrier violated the intent and provisions of the Clerks' Agreement when it refused to allow holiday pay to Store Department employes qualifying for payment thereof for the holiday occurring on September 1, 1958.
- 2. Carrier shall now be required to compensate employes Herman Janke, Sr., Roy Ramer and Elmer Jensen for eight (8) hours each at the pro rata rate of their respective regularly assigned chauffeur positions for the Labor Day holiday occurring on September 1, 1958.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the Carrier and Employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon was waived by the parties and under date of April 29, 1960, the parties jointly addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case from further consideration by the Division, which request is hereby granted.

#### **AWARD**

Case dismissed.
