## PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

## BROTHERHOOD OF MAINTENANCE OF WAY EMPLOYES UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- (1) The Carrier violated the effective Agreement when it failed and refused to allow Roadway Equipment Operator Howard Ring pay for the time he consumed in waiting at Troutdale, Oregon from 5:00 A. M. to 8:00 A. M. on January 8, 1958.
- (2) Roadway Equipment Operator Howard Ring be allowed three hours' straight time pay because of the violation referred to in Part (1) of this claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board finds:

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by complainant party; and

That no hearing thereon has been held, and under date of November 7, 1960, the complainant party addressed a formal communication to the Secretary of the Third Division requesting withdrawal of this case, which request is hereby granted.

## AWARD

Case dismissed.
