PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

BROTHERHOOD OF MAINTENANCE OF WAY EMPLOYES UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- (1) The Carrier violated the effective Agreement when it permitted Car Department employes, who hold no seniority rights under the effective Agreement, to construct and erect work benches in the new Diesel Shop at Salt Lake City, Utah;
- (2) First Class Carpenters W. L. Stauffer and L. P. Larsen be allowed pay at their respective straight time rate for an equal proportionate share of the total man-hours consumed by the employes of the Car Department in the performance of the work referred to in part one (1) of this claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, after giving the parties to this dispute due notice of hearing thereon and upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That carrier and employes involved in this dispute are respectively carrier and employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein;

That the dispute was certified to the Third Division of the Adjustment Board ex parte by the complainant party; and

That hearing thereon has been held and concluded. Under date of July 3, 1961, the parties jointly advised the Secretary of the Third Division of their desire to withdraw this case from further consideration by the Division which request is hereby granted.

AWARD

Case dismissed.
