PARTIES TO DISPUTE: (

(Terminal Railway Alabama State Docks

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood that:

- (1) The dismissal of Welder Charles Shell was excessive, without just and sufficient cause and wholly disproportionate to the offense with which charged.
- (2) Welder Charles Shell be reinstated with all rights unimpaired and compensated for all wage loss suffered since September 1, 1972.

OPINION OF BOARD: In this discipline case we find that: (1) Claimant was afforded due process; (2) there is substantial probative evidence of probative value which supports Carrier's finding of Claimant's guilt; and (3) under the circumstances presented here, the discipline imposed was not unreasonable.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employes involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.
