PARTIES TO DISPUTE:

(Robert W. Blanchette, Richard C. Bond and John H. (McArthur, Trustees of the Property of Penn Central Transportation Company, Debtor

STATEMENT OF CLAIM: Claim of the System Committee of the Brotherhood (GL-7711) that:

- (a) The Carrier violated the Rules Agreement, effective February 1, 1968, particularly Rule 7-A-1, when the Director-Labor Relations denied the request for a hearing under the provisions of said rule.
- (b) Claimant E. P. Dyson now be awarded appropriate reparations because of the Carrier's denial of the Claimant's due process afforded him by Rule 7-A-1.

OPINION OF BOARD: A review of the Agreement between the parties indicates that the subject of sick leave allowances is covered by Rule 4-1-1. Sick leave allowance is not a subject "otherwise than covered by these rules." Accordingly, we find that the Carrier properly rejected the request for a hearing on appeal under Rule 7-A-1. The lack of merit in the present claim is further reflected in the fact that the Employes could have progressed the issue of Claimant's entitlement to a sick leave allowance for April 27, 1973, under the proper rules of the Agreement. They did not process such a claim. Therefore we will deny the claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board, upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employes involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.

## AWARD

Claim denied.
