Claim of the General Committee of the Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen on the Southern Railway

Company et al.:

On behalf of Signal Maintainer E. R. Sanders, Warner Robbins, Ga., for two hours' straight time account Communications Maintainer D. M. Tucker, Macon, Ga., going to Macon Relay Shop on February 10, 1975, and loaded a 2 A Mechanism and took to C&S Supervisor J. K. Murphy to use on remote control switches on the Signal 4400 volt transmission line near Tifton, Ga., Tucker having loaded the mechanism at 9:30 a.m. and unloaded it at Tifton, Ga., at 11:30 a.m. /Carrier file: SG-98/

OPINION OF BOARD: For the reasons set forth in our Award 21635 and with particular reference to Third Division Awards 10613 and 12188, we deny the claim.

FINDINGS: The Third Division of the Adjustment Board upon the whole record and all the evidence, finds and holds:

That the parties waived oral hearing;

That the Carrier and the Employes involved in this dispute are respectively Carrier and Employes within the meaning of the Railway Labor Act, as approved June 21, 1934;

That this Division of the Adjustment Board has jurisdiction over the dispute involved herein; and

That the Agreement was not violated.

AWARD

Claim denied.
