DISPUTE:

Claim of Trainman B.A. Hoggard, Toronto, for difference in earnings between Trainman and Conductor's rate of pay on 4 March 1987.

JOINT STATEMENT OF ISSUE:

On 4 March 1987 B.A. Hoggard was called to work as Brakeman in straight away service on passenger trains 129-128 Toronto to North Bay, and return.

Upon completion of their tour of duty at North Bay, the Conductor of that assignment booked rest.

As a result, Trainman Hoggard was promoted to work as Conductor on Train 128, the return portion of the trip North Bay to Toronto.

Trainman Hoggard was compensated at the Brakeman's rate of pay from Toronto to North Bay and Conductor's rate of pay North Bay to Toronto.

The Union contends that Trainman Hoggard is entitled to Conductor's rate of pay for his tour of duty Toronto to North Bay in accordance with Article 63.1 of Agreement 4.16

The Company declines the Union's contention.
