STATEMENT OF CLAIM

OPINION OF THE BOARD


Claimant M. J. Napolitan was a Trackman in Ashtabula, Ohio. On June 15, 1984, he was charged with attempted theft of gasoline. A hearing into the matter was held on June 25, 1984. As a result of that hearing, Claimant was found guilty as charged and dismissed from Carrier's service.


This Board has reviewed the complete record of the case and must conclude that the record supports Carrier's actions.
